Putting People First

Every day I hear from people who are struggling with cost of living issues. Electricity prices have increased by 60 per cent since the privatisation of the poles and wires by the Berejiklian-Barilaro Government.





Waiting lists in public hospitals are too high and people are being pushed into the private system, which is just another cost. We don't have enough ambulance crews or vehicles in Maitland compared to other areas in our region.

Most of our public schools are at capacity, with too many demountables and massive maintenance backlogs. We've seen schools having to fundraise to get air conditioning when the temperature is soaring into the 40s in February. School children are walking long distances to get to school because they can't access free school travel and many families can't afford public transport on weekends.

Public housing waiting lists are too long. Too many vulnerable people are couch-surfing, living in cars, or worse. Mental health services are stretched beyond capacity with up-to-six month waiting lists. Domestic violence is happening in too many homes in our community. We must do more to prevent domestic and family violence and assist victims and survivors.

The Berejiklian-Barilaro Government has cut our services to the bone to fund their Sydney light rail cost blowouts and build stadiums in Sydney. This Government has all the wrong priorities for people living outside of Sydney. They need to start putting people first, particularly those in regions such as Maitland.

Please contact my office if you have any issues accessing Government services or are struggling with cost-of-living expenses.

Jenny writes

What an honour it has been to represent our community during the past four years. We have achieved much together and I am so grateful for the work of our many volunteers who provide services to improve the welfare, sporting activities and cultural life of everyone in Maitland.

I am so pleased plans for the new Maitland Hospital have progressed. After our campaign spanning more than seven years, we will get a fully funded public hospital and our efforts resulted in a \$70 million funding increase. This brings the total committed expenditure to \$470 million, all because of our efforts.

The mobility upgrade to the Victoria Street Station has finally been delivered. However, construction of the new \$3.8 million Rutherford ambulance station is yet to commence. The Government has failed to fix the congestion at the Maitland Railway Roundabout, failed to complete the duplication of the Thornton overpass, and failed to complete the \$7 million pledge for two lanes on the New England Highway between Racecourse Road and Anambah Road, Rutherford.

As I write, the light rail in Newcastle, which replaced the heavy rail ripped up by the Premier when she was Minister for Transport, still isn't carrying passengers. After four years that is a disgrace. The Government must stop the demolition of the Sydney stadiums and invest in our regions.

I have been and will continue to be a strong voice for Maitland. Thank you for the opportunity to serve our community.

What are the CBP Grants?

The Community Building Partnership Grants are an annual grant program open to incorporated not for profit organisations and local councils designed to promote and support infrastructure projects that deliver positive social, environmental and recreational outcomes, while promoting community participation, inclusion and cohesion.

What are the Local Sport Grants?

The local sport grant program aims to increase regular and on-going participation opportunities in sport and active recreation through project types in the areas of sport development, community sport events, sport access and facility development.

Representing you in the NSW Parliament

The NSW Parliament has risen for the year and will not sit again before the next election. In this term I have spoken in the Parliament 318 times, on the NSW Budget, various pieces of legislation, motions, petitions lodged by our community, community recognition statements, private members statements and matters of public importance as well as asking questions of various Ministers. I have asked 647 questions on notice to Ministers and moved 48 notices of motion about issues relating to Maitland, the Hunter and our State.

As Shadow Minister for the Prevention of Domestic Violence and Sexual Assault, Shadow Minister for Small Business since March 2016 and acting Shadow Minister for Women since March 2018

I have undertaken over 40 meetings around NSW to consult with regional communities like Maitland as well as metropolitan areas to develop policy and receive feedback on the Government's policies.

I am proud of what we have been able to achieve as a community during the last four years. Here are just some of the wins we have made through pressuring the Government to:

- Ensure the new Maitland Hospital is a fully funded public hospital
- Increase funding by \$70 million for the new Maitland Hospital to \$470 million
- Stop the Rutherford Stink with the closure of Truegain
- Fund \$7.3 million to 23 Pacific Highway sub-contractors who were owed money in the wake of the Ostwald Brothers collapse
- Reinstate funding of \$250,000 to three domestic violence case management and counselling services

- Halt the tendering out of the Women's Domestic Violence Court Advocacy Service, which would have made the Hunter the largest area in the State and not funded some specialist positions
- Halt the sell-off of the Maitland Department of Lands Office Building to enable consideration of its development as a regional museum
- Install container deposit machines at Thornton,
 East Maitland, Rutherford,
 Aberglasslyn
- Introduce Paid Domestic
 Violence Leave for government
 workers
- Consult with students about sexual assault on university campuses
- Deliver a Sexual Assault Strategy
- Deliver a Women's Strategy
- Expand Rutherford, Bolwarra and Ashtonfield Public Schools
- Install new toilets at Gillieston Public School and undertake other maintenance works
- Reduce the maintenance backlogs at Maitland's public primary and high schools
- Commence construction of a new ambulance station at Rutherford



- Repair dangerous road surfaces near the Maitland Railway Roundabout
- Reverse some of the public sector job cuts
- Install accessible lifts at Victoria Street Station
- Fill casual positions in Maitland's public schools

In addition, with the help of my team, I have assisted people with issues like public housing access and maintenance, antisocial behaviour, school transport passes, out-of-zone school enrolments, and accessing health and mental health services through representations to various Ministers and their departments.

Active Kids Vouchers

If your children are involved in sport and fitness related activities, parents, guardians and carers can apply for a voucher valued up to \$100 per calendar year for each student enrolled in school.

The voucher may be used with a registered activity provider for registration, participation and membership costs for sport, fitness and active recreation activities.

The voucher can be used at any time during the calendar year it was issued. Just go to https://www.service.nsw.gov.au/transaction/apply-active-kids-voucher

Creative Kids

From early 2019, The Creative Kids program will include a \$100 voucher to be used towards the cost of participation in or tuition fees for activities such as music lessons, drama and theatre, language classes, visual arts, coding and design.

Time's running out to claim CTP Greenslip Refunds

If you were the registered owner of a private vehicle (excludes motorcycles) before December 2017, you may be eligible for a refund of part of your 2017 CTP Green Slip (between \$10 and \$120). Refund amounts are calculated on a pro rata basis and subject to an administration fee.

You have until 30 June 2019 to claim your refund - go to https://my.service.nsw.gov.au/MyServiceNSW/CTPRefund

If the vehicle is registered under a business name and you have not received a refund cheque in the post, please call 13 77 88.

Council looks after local roads, rubbish collection, rates, sporting fields, parks, footpaths, street lighting, residential and commercial development, council bylaws, maintenance of parks and gardens, animal control, and signage.
